



MASERATI CLUB CHARTER

Art. 1 Name

An independent, non-profit and non-political association called "MASERATI CLUB" (hereinafter the "**Association**") is hereby established.

Art. 2 Registered office and Logo

The Association's registered office is in Viale Ciro Menotti 322, Modena.

The Association's logo is the MASERATI oval with trident inside a grey shield, with the word "CLUB" underneath. In documentation relating to the history of MASERATI, this logo shall be placed alongside the rectangular logo previously used as the logo of the MASERATI REGISTER. Neither logo shall be used without the authorisation of MASERATI S.p.A., which shall be permitted to grant licences for the use of the two logos. The Association shall enter into a licence contract with MASERATI S.p.A, valid for one year with tacit renewal, from which MASERATI S.p.A. shall be permitted to withdraw at any moment and for any reason.

Art. 3 Purpose of the Association

The Association pursues the purpose of promoting the historic and cultural status of Maserati cars, especially vintage Maserati cars, including those classified as vintage under the A.S.I.-F.I.V.A. regulations, and of promoting interest in and the exchange and diffusion of information about all Maserati cars, creating and fostering fellowship between Maserati car owners, and organising cultural events, meetings and congresses.

The aforesaid promotion shall apply to all the other Maserati cars no longer in production but considered of particular historic interest, or which have been built with identifiable components on chassis of other marques with Maserati engines and/or components, and all vehicles, of any name, produced by the Maserati Brothers.





To this end, the Association shall engage in all activities useful for the achievement of its purpose, also by supplying information material to and maintaining relations with other Italian and foreign Organisations and Associations, in accordance with the A.S.I. federation directives previously agreed with the Maserati Register.

On the instructions of MASERATI S.p.A., the Association shall promote coordination with the foreign Maserati Clubs by collecting the relative programmes, using due vigilance to ensure the protection of the MASERATI S.p.A. brand and image.

Art. 4 Members

Applications for membership of the Association from Italian and foreign candidates, including those not resident in Italy, shall be assessed by the Members Committee, the decision of which shall be final.

On its establishment, the Association shall enrol all Maserati Register Members as founder members, together with any members of the previous Maserati Club who wish to join, on simple request.

a) Ordinary Members

Ordinary Members shall be individuals who submit a membership application bearing the signatures of two Members as sponsors. The membership application shall be accompanied by sponsorship submissions from two Members and shall be assessed by the Members Committee, the decision of which shall be final. The essential precondition for Ordinary Member status is ownership of at least one Maserati car, which shall be described in detail in the membership application.

Cars of **over twenty years of age** (at the time of application) or those classified as being vintage cars according to A.S.I.-F.I.V.A. regulations or of particular historical interest according to the opinion of the Club's Technical Commission shall **undergo the registration and/or certification** procedures





and shall comply with the "**Maserati Classics**" Certification and Authenticity Criteria enclosed as **annex A)** of this Charter.

Ordinary Members owning a car with the above characteristics are not obliged to perform registration and/or certification in order to maintain Member status, however, in order to participate with their vehicle in Club events they are required to apply for registration and/or certification, agreeing on the type thereof with the Technical Commission.

If the car undergoes registration, subject to examination of the same and any documentation that may be provided with it, the Technical Commission shall "**register**" the car in the Historical Register, issuing the Member with a certificate and car ID plate. The certificate and ID plate **are free of charge for the first car**, however, any other cars the Member may own shall only be registered subject to reimbursement of the cost of the certificate and plate to the Club Secretary. This cost shall be established annually by the Executive Committee.

Members owning several cars will be eligible for a **progressive 15% discount** on the registration expenses for each car whose registration they might request after the second, the lower limit being the cost of the ID plate alone.

Those Members who possess a registration certificate for their car issued by the Maserati Register may request, subject to advance payment of **two thirds of** the amount indicated above, a new registration plate with the Maserati Club logo and with the same registration number attributed previously to the car.

For race/sports cars and any other special or experimental cars that the Technical Commission may consider eligible, the Member shall present the Technical Commission with an "**authentication certification**" application, to be issued by the Manufacturer.

Authentication certification makes Members eligible to request, without any formality and/or additional charge, that the Technical Commission "**registers**" the car and issues the relative ID plate.





Members who possess two or more vehicles shall be eligible for a **progressive 15% discount** on the certification expenses for each car certified after the first, registration included.

In order to participate with more than one car in the scheduled meetings and to involve their families more directly in the events, Ordinary Members may apply for enrolment in the Association of as many Family Members as Maserati/OSCA vehicles legitimately owned after the first. The annual enrolment fee shall be established by the Executive Committee and, in any case, shall be **no more than half** that of annual membership renewal.

Members undertake to obey the rules contained in this Charter and to behave in an ethical and moral manner, compatible with the purposes of the Association. Each Member shall also be obliged to co-operate **without motives of personal gain** to assure the successful operation of the Association, and shall be duty bound to comply with the rulings of the Executive Committee, the rules dictated from time to time by the persons assigned to specific posts by the Committee itself, and the general and specific Regulations of each event.

b) Honorary Members

The following persons shall have Honorary Membership:

- the personalities unanimously designated as such by the Executive Committee by reason of their specific merits;
- the Chairman of MASERATI S.p.A.;
- the Managing Director/ Chief Executive of MASERATI S.p.A.;
- the Chairmen of the foreign Maserati Clubs recognised by the Association.

Art. 5 Loss of Membership Status - Expulsion

Ordinary Member status shall be lost if the Association is wound up, in case of death, through voluntary resignation or expulsion from the Association, and due to loss of the preconditions for membership.





Ordinary Membership status shall also be automatically forfeited - without any need for a ruling by the Members Committee - (i) in case of delay in payment of the membership fee protracted after the end of the association (calendar) year, (ii) in case of failure to submit the application for issue of the Authenticity Certificate or (iii) if the only car of which the Member is legitimate owner fails to meet the Authenticity preconditions for issue of the Authenticity Certificate.

The Executive Committee shall expel Members from the Association, at its own absolute and final discretion, if the Members concerned have failed to fulfil their membership obligations as follows:

- B compliance with the spirit of the association;
- B exclusion of all profit-making intentions, of any kind;
- B correct use by the Member of the logos licensed to the association by MASERATI S.p.A;
- B participation in Association life and attendance at the Association's General Meetings;
- B everything else that may contribute to a proper, constructive relationship with the Association and its Governing Bodies.

Honorary Members are elected for life but may submit their resignation, and are exonerated from the payment of the membership fee.

Art. 6 Membership Fee

Each year, the Executive Committee shall set the membership fee, and any other fee payable by new members. Except in the case of new members, the annual membership fee shall be paid to the Association office by 10 February of each year. In addition to the Ordinary Membership fee and the fee paid for any Family Members, Members may elect, when interested in the issue of the relative certification and the services provided, to add the ASI membership fee, as established by the ASI each year.





Any Member failing to pay the membership fee by 31 March of the year concerned may be suspended by the Executive Committee; such Members shall be readmitted on payment of the membership fee before the end of the association (calendar) year.

Art. 7 Association Governing Bodies

The Association's Governing Bodies are:

- the General Meeting
- the Executive Committee
- the Chairman, appointed by the Executive Committee, subject to the contents of art. 16 below
- one or more Deputy Chairmen
- the Secretary
- the Treasurer
- the Register Committee
- the Technical Committee
- the Auditor
- the Members Committee
- the Board of Arbitration
- the Committee of Honour

All the members of the Association's Governing Bodies shall be Members, except for the members of the Technical Committee, the Auditor, members of the Board of Arbitration and the Committee of Honour, who may not necessarily be Members.

Art. 8 General Meeting

The General Meeting is open to all Ordinary Members who are up to date with payment of their membership fees: Honorary Members and Family Members may also be invited to attend as consultants or to make suggestions on the items on the agenda.





General Meetings may be ordinary or extraordinary and may be called at the registered office or elsewhere in Italy. Voting on all topics on the agenda shall always be open.

Each Ordinary Member shall have just one vote and may authorise another Member, in writing, to represent him/her at the General Meeting. No Member shall represent more than five other Members. Ordinary Members may authorise a Family Member to represent him/her.

Votes shall always be open.

Art. 9 Role of the Ordinary General Meeting

The Ordinary General Meeting:

- approves the Association's budget and the financial statement of its revenues and expenditure each year;
- appoints the members of the Executive Committee of its own authority (see art. 15 below) - of which **at least three** must own a vintage car (a sports/racing car, a classic on-road model manufactured pre-1980 and any subsequent model at least twenty years old) and also be an ASI member - the Auditor, the members of the Register Committee and the members of the Board of Arbitration as per art. 28 below;
- decides on the topics specifically assigned to its jurisdiction by this Charter or submitted for its consideration by the Executive Committee.

The Ordinary General Meeting shall meet at least once a year, if possible before the end of March, in order to approve the financial statement for the previous year and the budget for the current year, and to discuss the other topics on the agenda.

The Ordinary General Meeting shall also meet whenever the Executive Committee considers it necessary, or when an application is made to the Executive Committee by at least one fifth of the Members, specifically stating the topics to be discussed.





Art. 10 Extraordinary General Meeting

The Extraordinary General Meeting decides on any proposal for amendment of the Association's Charter submitted by the Executive Committee or, in writing, by at least one third of the Members, the winding-up of the Association, and the appointment of the Liquidator or Liquidators.

Art. 11 Calling of the General Meeting

The General Meeting (Ordinary and/or Extraordinary) shall be called by the Chairman by written invitation sent to each Member at least fifteen clear days before the date set for the meeting.

The invitation shall state the topics on the agenda, the time and place of the meeting and, if the first calling is not quorate, the time and place of the second calling, which may also be on the same day as the first.

Art. 12 Quorum of Ordinary General Meeting

The Ordinary General Meeting at first calling shall be quorate with the presence or affidavits of more than one half of the Members; at second calling, it shall be quorate regardless of the number of Members present.

Resolutions shall be taken by absolute majority of the Members present. However, with regard to the appointment of the Elected Members of the Executive Committee, in the absence of unanimity and consequent appointment by acclamation, each Member shall be permitted to vote for no more than three candidates and the Committee shall consist of those who have obtained the largest number of votes, subject to the right of appointment assigned to MASERATI S.p.A. in art. 15 below.

In view of the number of Members or due to other circumstances, on some topics and/or proposals, relating to the ordinary performance of the Association's business, the Executive Committee may survey the Members, who shall give their opinions by the fastest means and thus even by post and/or fax, or through direct interaction on the Club website.





Art. 13 Quorum of Extraordinary General Meeting

The Extraordinary General Meeting, called whenever the Executive Committee considers it necessary, shall be quorate with the presence of at least two thirds of the Members with voting rights, and shall decide by the vote in favour of more than one half of those present.

Art. 14 Chairing of General Meetings, Minutes and Opposition

The General Meeting shall be chaired by the Chairman of the Association or, in his/her absence, by a Deputy Chairman, or failing this, by one of the members of the Executive Committee.

Minutes of the General Meeting shall be taken, in brief form if preferred, by the Secretary of the Association or, in his/her absence, by the Member chosen for the purpose by the Chairman of the Meeting.

Any opposition or appeals by Members shall be submitted to the Chairman of the Board of Arbitration (who shall work to achieve an out-of-court settlement of the dispute) within 30 days after the date of the Meeting.

Art. 15 Executive Committee

The Executive Committee consists of 11 members, 6 of whom elected by the General Meeting and 5 appointed by MASERATI S.p.A., who may also be Club Members.

The Executive Committee Members shall serve for two years and may be re-elected. MASERATI S.p.A. shall also have the right to submit a list of candidates for membership of the Executive Committee to the General Meeting, including the candidates for Association Chairman and Auditor.

The members of the Executive Committee must be permanently resident in Italy.

Art. 16 Chairman, Deputy Chairmen and Secretary

The Executive Committee elects the Chairman of the Association, two Deputy Chairmen, a Treasurer and a Secretary from amongst its members.





If one or more Executive Committee members have to be replaced, the Committee shall co-opt a new member if the Committee member to be replaced was elected by the General Meeting, or shall ask MASERATI S.p.A. to name a replacement if the Committee Member to be replaced was appointed by MASERATI S.p.A..

The appointments of the co-opted Committee members shall expire at the same time as those of the members already serving.

Art. 17 Duties of the Executive Committee

The Executive Committee is the Association's executive body and decides on all matters concerning its management.

In particular the Executive Committee:

- decides the direction, running and extent of the Association's activities;
- draws up Rules of a general nature concerning the running of the events organised or sponsored by the Association;
- establishes permanent and/or temporary “Events and Sponsorship Committees”, nominating the members thereof, for the organisation of events, participation in races and any other undertaking useful for the achievement of the Association's purposes;
- in order to facilitate the organisation of local events, it may nominate Club Members to act as Provincial and/or Regional delegate, according to the number of members registered with the Club in the Delegate’s home Province or Region;
- draws up motions to be submitted to the General Meeting;
- drafts the expenditure programmes with the reports to be submitted for the approval of the General Meeting;
- draws up proposals for the amendment of this Charter and proceeds to adopt the relative Regulations (if any), and decides the binding interpretation of the contents of the Charter;





- approves disciplinary measures against Members if this is considered necessary, subject to art. 5 above;
- appoints the Members Committee;
- appoints one of the members of the Technical Committee.

Art. 18 Executive Committee meetings

Executive Committee meetings may be called by the Chairman, or if he is incapacitated, by one of the Deputy Chairmen, whenever this is considered appropriate.

The meeting shall be called by letter, e-mail, fax or telegram sent at least fifteen days before the date of the meeting; in urgent circumstances, it may be called by telephone with at least three days' notice.

Executive Committee meetings shall also be called when requested by at least one third of the Committee members.

Executive Committee meetings shall be quorate when at least 7 of the Committee's members are present.

Executive Committee meetings shall be chaired by the Chairman or, in his absence, by the most senior Deputy Chairman present, or by another Committee member appointed by those present. Minutes of meetings shall be taken, in brief form if preferred, by the Secretary of the Association or, in his absence, by a Committee member chosen for the purpose by the Chairman of the meeting.

The Committee shall decide by majority vote; in case of a tie, the person chairing the meeting shall have the casting vote.

Art. 19 Chairman of the Association

The Chairman of the Association is its Legal Representative. He may perform all acts not specifically assigned to the General Meeting and the Executive Committee and is invested with all powers and the relative rights for achievement of the Association's purposes and those defined by the Charter.





If the Association's management requires, the Chairman may assign the powers to perform specific acts and/or functions both to Executive Committee members and to any Member of the Association.

The Chairman of the Association (who is also Chairman of the Executive Committee) or, if he is incapacitated, the most senior Deputy chairman, shall therefore:

- ensure the implementation of the resolutions of the General Meeting and the Executive Committee;
- call General Meetings;
- manage the Association's assets with the assistance of the Executive Committee;
- represent the Association in legal proceedings;
- exercise all powers assigned to him/her by the Executive Committee.

Art. 20 Register Committee

The principal purpose of the Register Committee, consisting of three Ordinary Members who own at least one vintage Maserati car, is to promote the vintage Maserati cars and any other aspects related in any way to the Brand's history and sporting tradition. The Register Committee advises and submits proposals to the Executive Committee, and as regards technical aspects, shall make use of the necessary, binding advice of the Technical Committee.

The Register Committee may annually and unanimously choose to award an acknowledgement (a white gold badge bearing the Tipo 26 logo) to any individual, not necessarily an Association member, who has played a particularly prominent role in the promotion of the Brand and the Club. All connected costs shall be at the Club's expense.

Register Committee members shall serve a two-year term of office and may be re-elected.





Art. 21 Technical Committee

The Technical Committee consists of three members, who may or may not be Members of the Association, who are particularly knowledgeable concerning the construction engineering of Maserati cars: two of the three members shall be chosen from the candidates specifically put forward by MASERATI S.p.A. on the request of the Executive Committee, which shall appoint the third member independently.

The Technical Committee, **also as regards the provisions set forth in subsection 4/a above**, shall be responsible for examining the cars of the Members and all those requesting acceptance as Association members, and for checking their authenticity, preservation and restoration on the basis of the "Maserati Classics" Certification and Authenticity Criteria enclosed as **annex A)** to this Charter that do not conflict with the A.S.I.'s Technical Regulations and that for proven specific needs (materials/spares no longer available and/or buildable) may be **justifiably waived**. It shall also provide the Members with recommendations concerning any modifications to be made to their cars, and check that these have been carried out. Its judgement is binding for Members, who shall not be permitted to oppose the Technical Commission's inspections. Each individual Member is therefore obliged to make any modifications suggested by the Technical Committee without delay, and to permit the relative inspections by the Technical Committee on completion of the work.

The members of the Technical Committee shall decide by absolute majority. The members appointed by MASERATI S.p.A. shall serve until they resign or are replaced by MASERATI S.p.A., while the third member appointed by the Executive Committee shall serve for two years and may be reappointed.

Art. 22 Secretary

The Secretary assists the Executive Committee, provides secretarial services, oversees and co-ordinates the relations between all the foreign Clubs recognised by the Association and MASERATI S.p.A., co-ordinates relations





with Maserati Classics, maintains contacts with and between the Members, manages contacts between the Association and the Press and takes the minutes of the General Meeting.

The post of Secretary is compatible with that of Deputy Chairman and Treasurer; the Secretary may use the services of one or more people, who may or may not be Members, for the fulfilment of his duties.

Art. 23 Treasurer

The Treasurer shall be responsible for attending to the administrative and accounting management of the Association and updating and keeping of accounting registers, current account transactions and relative credits and debits, with dedicated proxy from the Association Chairman.

The post of Treasurer is compatible with that of Executive Committee Member and Secretary.

Art. 24 Members Committee

The Members Committee, consisting of three Members (two appointed by the Executive Committee and one by MASERATI S.p.A.) examines and decides - unanimously - on Ordinary Member membership applications submitted in accordance with art. 4 of this Charter, regardless of the place of residence of the applicant.

The members of the Members Committee shall serve for two years and may be reappointed.

Art. 25 Remuneration

The Secretary, the members of the Executive Committee, the Chairman, the Auditor, the Arbitrators and the members of the Register Committee, the Members Committee and the Technical Committee, as well as any Members appointed to specific posts, give their services free of charge and are not entitled to any remuneration. However, the Executive Committee may decide - unanimously - to reimburse the expenses incurred by its members for the





fulfilment of their appointments and/or for specific, clearly defined activities (organisation of meetings, congresses, etc.).

Art. 26 Association Assets

The Members' memberships fees, any donations, and revenues deriving to the Association in any way from its activities, constitute the revenues for use for pursuance of the Association's purposes.

The funds shall be deposited in one or more current accounts opened in the Association's name with one or more banks chosen by the Executive Committee: the aforesaid current accounts shall be opened by the Chairman, who shall perform transactions him/herself and/or may authorise the Secretary, the Treasurer and/or another member of the Executive Committee to perform specific banking transactions necessary for the Association's normal operations.

Art. 27 Auditor

The Auditor shall audit the expenditure, documentation and financial statements submitted by the Executive Committee and, when necessary, report to the General Meeting. The Auditor shall serve a two-year term of office and may be re-elected. The Auditor shall not be a member of the Executive Committee.

Art. 28 Association Year

For the purposes of the financial statements and other purposes, the Association's year starts on the first of January and ends on the thirty-first of December of each year.

The financial statement for the financial period which ended on the thirty-first of December of each year, together with the reports of the Executive Committee and the Auditor, shall be deposited at the Association's registered office at the Members' disposal at least twenty days before the General Meeting called for approval of the same.





Art. 29 Board of Arbitration

The General Meeting elects the Board of Arbitration, consisting of three members, who may or may not be Members of the Association, who shall elect the Chairman of the Board. The Arbitrators shall serve for two years and may be reappointed.

The following may not be appointed members of the Board of Arbitration:

- members of the Executive Committee;
- members of the Register Committee and Technical Committee;
- the Auditor.

The Board of Arbitration is called to reach judgement, with exclusive final jurisdiction, on any disputes arising between the Members and the Association or its Governing Bodies, or between the Members themselves, in the context of the Association's activities as envisaged by these Articles of Association. The Board of Auditors shall however have no jurisdiction over disputes between the Members and the Association relating in any way to the definition of the authenticity of a vintage Maserati car. The Board of Auditors decides on the basis of equity and by majority vote, through simple, informal arbitration, with no formalities or procedural constraints, and the parties shall always be assured the widest power to defend themselves.

The Board of Auditors meets on the written request of a Member, the Association and/or another Association Managing Body, but its meetings may also be called for preventive or consultative purposes.

Art. 30 Committee of Honour

The Executive Committee shall also establish the Committee of Honour, a committee of from 5 (five) to 10 (ten) Honorary Members. The Committee shall fulfil a consultative function on matters relating to the Association's activities, and on the specific request of the Executive Committee and/or the General Meeting it shall provide non-binding recommendations and opinions passed unanimously.





Art. 31 Duration and termination of the Association

The Association is constituted for an open-ended term. However, the Extraordinary Meeting may decide to wind up the Association at any time, deciding the liquidation procedures and appointing one or more Liquidators and setting their powers, and also deciding to transfer any residual assets to one or more Organisations with a similar purpose, or with research and/or charitable purposes.

As a non-profit and non-commercial association, the Association is the sole holder of the relative assets, including sums paid in advance by Members for participation in the Association's activities. Therefore, if the Association is wound up it shall not be possible in any way to return any cash on hand to the Members.

Under all circumstances, funds shall only be used for the achievement of the Association's institutional activities/purposes and those directly connected to the same, with the exclusion of all distribution of profits of any kind to the Members.

Therefore, withdrawal of a Member from the Association for any reason shall not generate any rights over the Association's assets.

Moreover, the membership fees shall not be revalued or transferred, even if the Association is wound up due to the causes envisaged by the Italian Civil Code.

Art. 32 Extension of authority

If, for whatever reason, two solar years have passed since the previous elections, as an interim measure, the Association's Governing Bodies shall remain in office until such time as the subsequent elections for the new Governing Body members are held.





Art. 33 Legal Jurisdiction

All matters not covered by this Charter shall be governed by the contents of the Italian Civil Code with regard to unrecognised associations; legislation concerning commercial enterprises shall not apply.

ANNEX A

"MASERATI CLASSICS" CERTIFICATION AND AUTHENTICATION CRITERIA

1. General Guidelines

Below we specify the criteria on the basis of which Maserati Classics (hereinafter “**Maserati**”) determines whether cars submitted for the certification procedure (Maserati racing cars or Maserati road-going cars having construction date at least 20 years prior to the date of the certification application) (hereinafter “**Car**”) can be considered authentic. It is understood that Maserati will rule on the Car's authenticity by applying these authenticity criteria in their most up-to-date version, available on the www.owners.Maserati.com website.

The Car shall only be considered authentic if it is in working order and if the inspections performed by Maserati have revealed that all the following components of the Car meet the specific criteria listed below:

- chassis;
- engine
- gearbox - transmission
- suspensions - brakes - wheels
- bodywork - interiors

All the original components must be mounted on the Car, except for cases in which, for cars which compete in historic races, the Car's owner possesses these components but they have been replaced or modified to render the Car compliant with the safety rules contained in the relevant technical regulations.





If even just one of the aforesaid components of the Car is found to be nonconforming, the Car shall be ruled not to be authentic and the authenticity certificate (hereinafter the "**Authenticity Certificate**") shall not be issued. If it is possible to correct the nonconformity of the Car's non-authentic components, Maserati shall inform the Car's owner accordingly, specifying the type of work to be done to allow the components concerned to be considered to meet the authenticity criteria.

No Authenticity Certificate shall be issued with regard to cars the aforesaid components of which have been modified by preparers and/or designers, unless the preparer and/or designer has been specifically requested to make the said modifications by Maserati.

If the Authenticity Certificate is issued, the technical data sheet may contain reservations regarding not the authenticity but the condition in more general terms of specific components of the Car (e.g.: the chassis is authentic but there is rust damage and it has been repaired). These reservations do not therefore reduce the car's authenticity as certified in the Authenticity Certificate.

The non authenticity of the Car's accessories and/or other parts shall not prevent issue of the Authenticity Certificate, but in all cases such factors will be recorded on the technical data sheet accompanying the Authenticity certificate, in the form of an additional reservation (e.g.: the Car's tanks are not the same as those originally installed on the Car).

2. Specific authenticity criteria

Chassis:





The chassis shall be considered authentic if:

- a) it is complete and carries its identifying chassis number punched in the original position with the original punches;
- b) it is complete and carries its identifying chassis number punched in the original position with the original punches, and has rust damage and/or accident damage only;
- c) it is complete and carries its identifying chassis number punched in the original position with the original punches and has been repaired or in part rebuilt by the authorised (original) supplier using the original construction drawings and the materials specified in the bill of materials of the time.

Engine:

The engine shall be considered authentic if:

- a) its identifying markings (original punch markings) and an inspection of the external accessories reveal that it is the engine originally installed on the Car;
- b) it is of the same type as the engine originally installed on the Car although it bears the identifying markings (original punch markings) of another car of the same type (the engine number is not the same as the Car's serial number).

Gearbox - Transmission:

The gearbox/transmission assembly shall be considered authentic if:

- a) its identifying markings (original punch markings) reveal that it is the assembly originally installed on the Car (associated to the Car by the assembly log);
- b) it is of the same type as that originally installed although it carries the identifying markings (original punch markings) of an assembly originally installed on another car.





Suspensions - brake system - wheels:

The suspensions shall be considered authentic if:

- a) they have been assembled with the parts originally installed on the Car;
- b) they have been assembled with original parts identical to those originally installed, even if they have been overhauled and/or reconditioned.

The brake system shall be considered authentic if:

- a) it is the system originally installed on the Car;
- b) it consists of original parts identical to those originally installed, even if they have been overhauled and/or reconditioned.

The wheels (rims) shall be considered authentic if:

- a) they are those originally installed on the Car;
- b) they are of the same type, in styling and dimensions, as those originally installed on cars of the same model.

Bodywork - interiors:

The bodywork shall be considered authentic if:

- a) all its components are original;
- b) the external visual appearance (shape, dimensions and proportions) is exactly the same as the model's original appearance, and, although repairs have been done to restore or rebuild parts that have suffered accident damage or deterioration, the same materials as in the original bodywork have been used without changing its original shape, dimensions and proportions.





The interiors shall be considered authentic if:

- a) all the components are those originally installed on the Car;
- b) their external visual appearance (shapes, dimensions and proportions) is identical to that of the suspensions originally installed on the model and they have been repaired, overhauled or reconditioned with materials and procedures identical to those of the original model.

Accessories:

Specifically, the following are considered as accessories:

- the exhaust system: manifolds, silencers, etc.;
- tanks in general (fuel, oil, etc.);
- pumps in general (fuel, lubrication, etc.);
- some bodywork features, such as: headlamp trim, colour, etc.;
- nameplates and badges.

The accessories shall be considered authentic if:

- a) they are those originally installed on the Car;
- b) their external visual appearance (shapes, dimensions and proportions) is identical to that of the accessories originally installed on the Car and they have been repaired, overhauled and/or reconditioned with materials and procedures identical to those of the original accessories.
